


# THE TELEGRAPH SCHOOL AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

### NATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT SURVEY IN DBB

NATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT SURVEY was the largest, nationwide, sample-based education survey conducted on November 12,2021 across India to provide structured feedback on students' learning levels.

This system-level assessment programme was also conducted in Don Bosco School, Bandel. Grades 5,8 and 10 participated in it. A team of four members sampled thirty students from each grade. The students were given seats according to NAS IDs. General instructions relating AT and PQ and filling of OMRs were given from 9.30 AM to 10.20 a.m. AT Booklets were distributed to the students, as per Control Sheet at 10.20 a.m. PQ was distributed to students of Grades 8 & 10 for attempting and Grade 5 be filled up in interactive mode. SQ and TQ were filled by the Head of the institution and twelve subject teachers.

While it was important to be a part of this survey conducted by the Ministry of Education, COVID safety protocols were maintained with utmost care.
